Practice Overview

Philip is a barrister for everyone. From opposing silks in finance proceedings and High Court work all the way down to his 20 years volunteering at a law clinic in Waterloo, he will be wherever there is challenge. His practice leans toward care proceedings for children and that, combined with his initial practice in crime means he has singularly acute witness-handling skills and a particular ability to identify the essence of a complicated case. Those skills are invaluable in other cases: private law disputes, international law and money proceedings often cry out for robust, well-informed advice; polite but firm negotiations and the ability to take the gloves off if all of that fails. Philip can be relied upon for all three.

He rarely appeals -preferring to get things right first time or to find less expensive, more efficient solutions for clients -but has scored some notable successes on appeal.
